13.	<p>Chablis AC 'Marronniers' Bernard Legland, Burgundy, France</p> <p>Crisp, steely fruit with a hint of green, slaked with hints of lime, baked apple and minerals very crisp and yet full bodied with a rich core of fruit – no oak. The youthful Bernard Legland makes wonderfully correct and elegant Chablis.</p>	£27.95
14.	<p>Chablis 1er Cru 'Cote de Lechet' 2014, Daniel Dampt, Burgundy, France</p> <p>One of the finest, most gorgeous and delicious of all the 1er cru's – made by the Dampt family at their small estate that is hunkered down beneath the Lechet hill just outside the quaint village of Chablis. Dry, rich, textured and full of buttered apple pie and slight oak characters.</p>	£38.00
